Our Early Learning Program (TK and Kindergarten) is designed to maximize a child's natural tendencies—to question, explore, and create—through intentional, academic learning opportunities.

Our program seeks to broaden students' understanding of the world inside and outside the classroom and lay the foundation for a seamless transition into the rest of their academic journey. Our curriculum is both challenging and pedagogically appropriate for young learners, and our teachers' knowledge and passion inspires our students to discover how to make connections between classroom learning and the world around them, as well as how to use their knowledge to solve every day problems.

Discovery & Foundation: OUR CORE CURRICULUM

Students are exposed to a wide array of topics and material in their school day through our liberal arts and sciences curriculum.

LANGUAGE & LITERACY

Our curriculum fosters early literacy in our students by challenging them to develop their emerging skills in reading and writing. Teachers encourage phonological awareness and rich discussion, exposing students to a comprehensive vocabulary as they find new ways to describe their experiences.

MATH

In TK, teachers prepare students to use math at a Kindergarten level and to learn how math concepts and skills are integrated into all areas of life. Kindergarteners complete a first grade-level program, mastering basic mathematical concepts and processes such as patterns, money, times and dates, basic geometry, word problems, skip counting, and more.

WORLD DISCOVERY/CIVICS, HISTORY, SCIENCE

Our curriculum instills an overarching interest in community, social studies, and science. Students explore the world: they investigate regions, habitats, ecosystems, and cultures. Each week, students improve these foundations using a variety of sources, field trips, student centers, hands-on experiments, and more.

MOVEMENT/PE

Students in our Early Learning Program have a daily Movement/PE course to demonstrate the importance of movement in our lives. Through participation in activities like soccer, dance, and yoga, students hone age-appropriate gross motor skills, coordination, teamwork, safety, confidence, and sportsmanship.

SPECIALS

Through unique specials taught by Subject Expert Teachers, our early learners apply their creativity beyond the standard disciplines and explore different modes of self-expression.

STEM/Engineering	Students investigate, innovate, build, and use natural and man-made materials to explore science, technology, engineering, and math concepts, including the design process. Students learn Mandarin through music, dance, and art. Mandarin engages both sides of the brain and is a tonal language that asks students to attend to the basic sound of a word as well as the tone in which it is spoken. Writing Mandarin characters also provides visual and artistic stimulation.

Art	Students paint, draw, sculpt, and create while making cross-cultural connections establishing an appreciation for the arts, developing fine motor skills, and exploring art as a medium for self-expression.		
Drama/Performing Arts	Students are introduced to performance, speaking, singing, and dancing, reinforcing the importance of collaboration, taking turns, and imaginative play.
